A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Evans Fire Protection District was called to order by Chairperson Achziger at 6:30 p.m. on November 25, 2024, at Evans Fire Station 2, 2100 37th Street, Evans, Colorado, 80620.

AMENDMENTS TO AGENDA

No amendments requested. Director James moved to approve the agenda as presented. Director Watson seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC COMMENT

No public present.

CONSENT AGENDA

Director Schanwolf moved to approve the consent agenda. Director Naylor seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

PRESENTATION: PROGRAM MANAGERS

Chief DeSalvo informed the Board that Program Managers would be speaking briefly on their area of responsibility so the Directors may better understand the daily operations of the District. A-Shift Program Managers presented. No action required.

PUBLIC HEARING: 2025 BUDGET

Director Watson moved to open a public hearing on the 2025 budget. Director Schanwolf seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Attorney Powell certified for the record that notice of the budget hearing had been duly posted, no public was present, and no comments had been received from the public on the proposed budget.

Ms. Bowles presented the proposed 2025 budget.

Director Watson moved to close the public hearing. Director James seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Director Naylor moved to adopt Resolution 2024-07 approving the 2025 budget. Director James seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

REVIEW & CONSIDER RESOLUTION 2024-05 ADOPTING UPDATED CORA POLICY

Ms. Bowles noted that due to recent legislative changes an update to the District's open record request fees and policy was necessary. Director James moved to adopt Resolution 2024-05 Establishing a Policy for Requests for Public Records and Assessing Charges for the Production of Public Records. Director Naylor seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

REVIEW & CONSIDER IGA FOR THE ASSESSMENT AND COLLECTION OF FIRE IMPACT FEES

Ms. Bowles noted that an updated IGA for the Assessment and Collection of Fire Impact Fees was prepared following approval of the fire impact fee study at the October meeting. Director Watson moved to approve the updated IGA for the Assessment and Collection of Fire Impact Fees as presented. Director Naylor seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

REVIEW & CONSIDER RESOLUTION 2024-06 AMENDING BOARD OF DIRECTORS BYLAWS – IMPACT FEES

Ms. Bowles noted that due to new legislation regarding special district impact fees, an update to the Board's Bylaws is necessary. Director James moved to adopt Resolution 2024-06 Amending Board of Directors Bylaws. Director Schanwolf seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

REVIEW & CONSIDER FIRE MARSHAL JOB DESCRIPTION

Chief DeSalvo informed the Board that following review of the Fire Marshal position and discussion with the Fire Marshal a change to "exempt" status is recommended. Director Naylor moved to approve the amended Fire Marshal Job Description as presented. Director James seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

REVIEW & CONSIDER IGA FOR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONSE AND RESOURCE SHARING

Chief DeSalvo shared an updated IGA for Hazardous Materials Response, noting the previous IGA was dated 2008. Director Schanwolf moved to approve the IGA for Hazardous Materials Response as presented. Director Naylor seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

DISCUSSION: STRATEGIC PLAN PROCESS UPDATES

Chief DeSalvo reviewed the tentative schedule for the strategic plan consultants to meet with staff, stakeholders, and directors. Director Watson moved to hold a special meeting on December 9th at 6:30 p.m. Director Naylor seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Chief DeSalvo also reviewed a draft community survey the consultants plan to issue to citizens. The Board discussed the survey questions and offered suggestions.

A RESOLUTION: 1) APPROVING THE REGULAR BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING SCHEDULE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2025; AND 2) DESIGNATING POSTING LOCATIONS FOR NOTICES OF REGULAR AND SPECIAL MEETINGS

WHEREAS, the Evans Fire Protection District ("***District***") is a political subdivision of the State of Colorado, organized pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-101, *et seq.* ("***Special District Act***");

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-903, the District is required to meet regularly at a time and in a location to be designated by the Board of Directors ("***Board***"). In addition to its regular meetings, the Board also is authorized pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-903 to schedule special meetings as often as the needs of the District require, upon notice to each Director of the date, time, and location of such meeting, and of the purpose for which it is called. Regular and special meetings of the Board may be held in a physical location or may be held telephonically, electronically, or by other means that do not include physical presence;

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 24-6-402(2)(c), the District is required to designate annually at the Board's first regular meeting of each calendar year the public place for posting notices of the District's regular and special Board meetings at least 24 hours prior to each meeting. The District may designate a public website as the place at which notices of the District's regular and special Board meetings will be posted at least 24 hours prior to such meeting;

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-903, the notice of all meetings of the Board that are held telephonically, electronically, or by other means not including physical presence must include the method or procedure, including the conference number or link, by which members of the public can attend the meeting;

WHEREAS, the Board believes it is in the best interests of the District and the citizens it serves that:

- a) the Board be authorized to conduct its regular and special meetings either (i) at a physical location, (ii) at a physical location with telephonic or electronic attendance availability, or (iii) entirely telephonically or electronically, as the business needs and best interests of the District demand; and
- b) the District post notices of regular and special Board meetings online on the District's website, and, to the extent practicable, link the online Board meeting notices on social media platforms the District may utilize now or in the future, if any.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Evans Fire Protection District that:

1. Regular Board meetings for the calendar year 2025 shall be held on the following dates at 6:30 p.m. at a location to be determined by the Board and specified in the applicable meeting notice.

March 25, 2025

April 22, 2025

May 19, 2025

June 24, 2025

July 22, 2025

August 26, 2025

September 23, 2025

October 28, 2025

November 17, 2025

Special meetings of the Board shall be held as often as the needs of the District require, upon notice to each Director. The location of such regular and special meetings may include (i) physical location, (ii) a physical location with telephonic or electronic attendance availability, or (iii) an entirely telephonic or electronic location, as the business needs and best interests of the District demand.

2. Notices for meetings that will be held telephonically, electronically, or by other means not including physical presence shall include the method or procedure, including the conference number or link, by which members of the public can attend the meeting.

3. All notices of regular or special Board meetings shall be posted on the District's website at least 24 hours prior to each meeting at the following location: www.evansfiredistrict.org

To the extent practicable, (a) such notices shall be searchable by type of meeting, date of meeting, time of meeting, agenda contents, and any other category deemed appropriate by the Board, and (b) a link to the notices will also be posted on at least one of the social media platforms utilized by the District, if any.

4. In the event a meeting notice cannot be posted online due to internet service disruption, website unavailability, or other reason, the District designates the following location for physically posting a notice:

**RESOLUTION
BOARD OF DIRECTORS
EVANS FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, the Evans Fire Protection District ("***District***") is a political subdivision of the State of Colorado, organized pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-101, *et seq.* ("***Special Districts Act***"), to provide fire suppression, fire prevention and public education, rescue, hazardous materials, and emergency medical services to the citizens and property within its jurisdiction, and to individuals passing through its jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, the terms of office of Directors David James, Martin Schanwolf, and Tricia Watson shall expire after their successors are elected at the regular special District election to be held on May 6, 2025 ("Election") and take office; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Special District Act ("Act") and the Colorado Local Government Election Code ("Code"), the Election must be conducted to elect three Directors to serve for a term of four (4) years.

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 32-1-804(2), the District's Board of Directors ("***Board***") is authorized to name a Designated Election Official ("***DEO***") who is responsible for conducting the Election; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to set forth certain procedures concerning the conduct of the Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Board of Directors of the Evans Fire Protection District, in the County of Weld, State of Colorado that:

1. A regular polling place election of the eligible electors of the District shall be held on May 6, 2025, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. pursuant to and in accordance with the Act, Code, and all other applicable laws, rules, and regulations (collectively, "***Applicable Law***"). At that time, three Directors will be elected to serve a four-year term each.

2. At the Election, there shall be one election precinct for the convenience of the District's eligible electors, the boundaries of which shall be identical to the boundaries of the District. The location and address of the polling place at which the Election will be held is Station 2, 2100 37th Street, Evans, CO 80620.

This polling place also shall be the polling place for disabled electors and eligible electors not residing within the District, and for the delivery of absentee ballots to the DEO.

3. Applications for absentee ballots or for permanent absentee voter status may be filed with the DEO at the District's Administrative Offices, located at 2100 37th Street, Evans, CO 80620, no later than the close of business on the Tuesday immediately preceding the Election (April 29, 2025).

4. The Board hereby designates Sharon Bowles to serve as the District's Designated Election Official for the Election. The DEO may retain an elections consultant to serve as an Assistant Designated Election Official ("***Assistant DEO***") to perform, or assist the DEO in performing, all of the duties and responsibilities of the DEO in conducting the Election. The DEO and, if retained, Assistant DEO, shall have full authority to take any and all actions necessary and appropriate to conduct the Election, including, but expressly not limited to, publishing a Call for Nominations and designating one

or more polling place(s) within the boundaries of the District, all in accordance with the requirements of Applicable Law.

5. Self-Nomination and Acceptance forms are available at the Designated Election Official's office located at 2100 37th Street, Evans, CO. All candidates must file a Self-Nomination and Acceptance form with the Designated Election Official no earlier than January 1, nor later than the close of business (3:00 p.m.) on Friday, February 28, 2025.

6. If the only matter before the electors is the election of Directors of the District and if, at the close of business on March 4, 2025, there are not more candidates than offices to be filled at the Election, including candidates timely filing affidavits of intent no later than March 3, 2025, the Designated Election Official shall cancel the Election and declare the candidates elected. Notice of such cancellation shall be published and posted in accordance with the Code. The Notice and this resolution, signed by the Board Chair, shall be filed with the Division of Local Government.

7. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause, or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

8. The provisions of this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

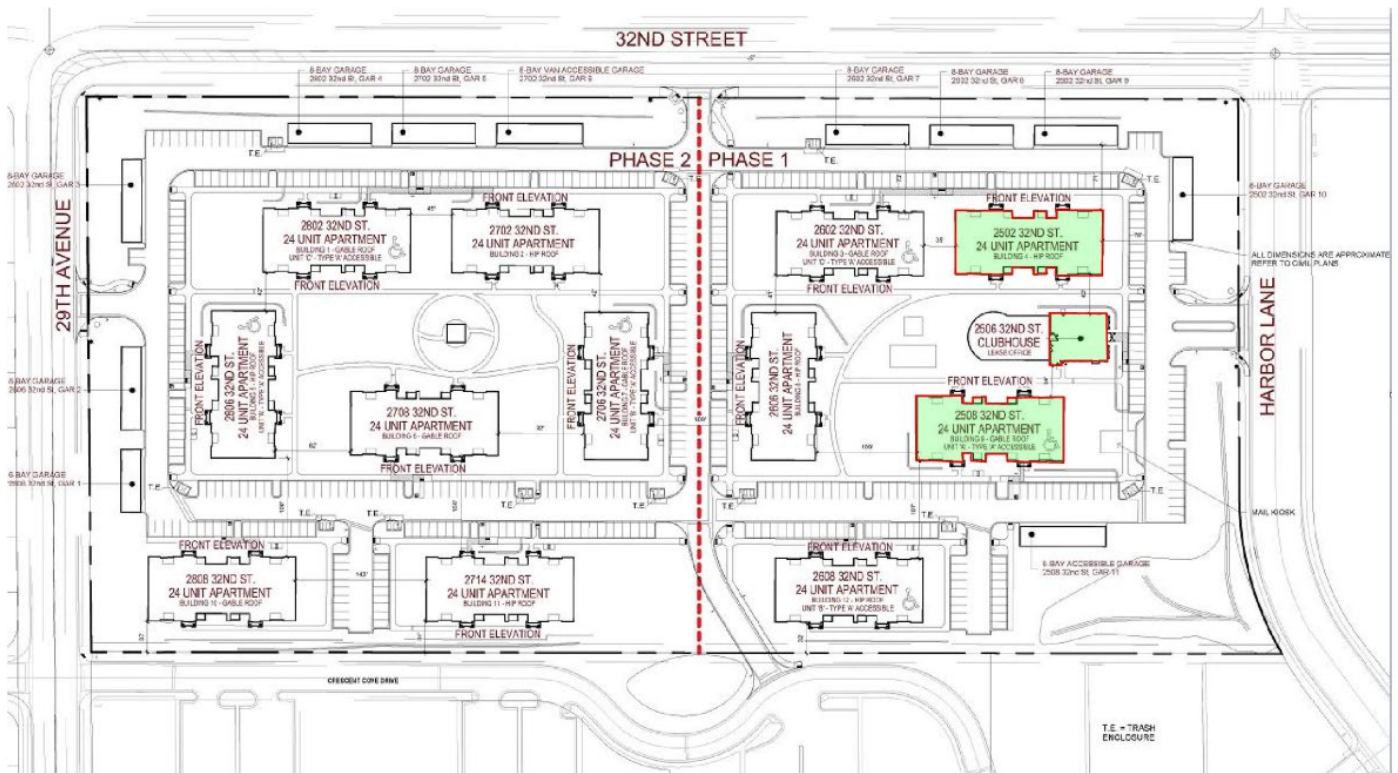


Fire Prevention Bureau Report: January 2025



January 2025 EFPD Highlights:

- Coordinated Burn Cell Testing with Michelle Podhirny from the Northern Colorado Regional Forensics Lab (Weld County Sheriff's Office) at our burn tower. She is working on her doctorate and researching the ability to obtain fingerprints from objects after they have been in a fire.
- Completed the final acceptance tests at the Reserve at Crescent Cove for the clubhouse, building #9 and building #4.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT



Dispatch

- There are still issues with the computer voice dispatching. No timeframe to get this back up and running.
- Public Safety I.T. has been made aware of our desire to be able to participate in closest-unit dispatching for the significant mutual aid calls (ie. structure fires, T/As requiring extrication, etc.) There will be no change to our existing auto-aid agreements, this will allow us to be recommended for calls requiring additional resources and in turn, we will receive the same benefit. There is no timetable for this currently.

EMS

- UC Health has implemented a program for operational compliance to provide fire districts with better data on how they are meeting the response time requirements in our contracts. This program will allow UCH and EFPD to look at the calls where they did not meet the response times set and evaluate the reasons why. They have people now that are solely dedicated to providing the data as required in our contract.

Strategic Planning

- On 12/9 & 12/10, representatives from CPSM conducted their field visit where they met with the shifts, command staff, and external partners from neighboring fire districts, the City of Evans, UCH, WCRCC, and a group of Evans citizens.
- We have reviewed the draft data report and sent it back to them for corrections/clarification on a few items.
- The community survey has been sent out and we are waiting for another week or two before it closes.
- They are continuing to follow up with us on any additional information that they need, but the next step will be to review a draft report in the next month.

Training

- Live fire training was held on the week of 12/16. All three shifts conducted evolutions with LaSalle and Platte Valley Fire Districts.



- The shifts are beginning their annual ice rescue refresher. Over the next few weeks, they will be conducting training at the Riverside pond.



Training Building

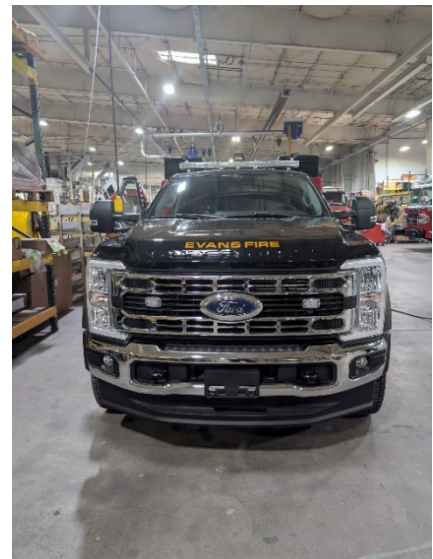
- The building has been fully completed and our crews have already started to train in it. We are beginning to work on the design of the interior to make it as useful and realistic as possible.





Brush Truck Refurb

- The truck is mostly complete with a few corrections to the graphics and shelving that need to be made after our visit on 1/17. They are also waiting for some parts to the pump that have been difficult to obtain.



Upcoming Projects

- The Truck Committee, lead by Apparatus Program Manager KC Skidmore, is developing the RFP for our next engine. The Board will see more information on this in February or March.
- Community Outreach Program Manager Taige Malone is working on bids to replace the current Station 2 sign with an upgraded, more visible digital sign. The Board will be presented with details at the March meeting.
- Respiratory Protection Program Manager Morgan Hill submitted an Assistance to Firefighters Grant application for the replacement of our current SCBA. This project is budgeted in the 2025 Capital Improvement Plan for \$350,000. Grant awards will be announced later in the year.

Current Staffing

- 22 total staff members
 - 18 full-time shift firefighters
 - One firefighter on workers comp leave until May
 - One firefighter on parental leave until mid-April
 - 4 full-time administrative staff
 - Fire Marshal position shared with PV & LaSalle

Around the Firehouse

- On 12/3, B-Shift responded to a traffic accident at Highway 85 & 31st Street. Upon arrival, crews encountered two vehicles that were involved, and one had rolled over with a patient still inside that needed to be extricated. It took approximately 15 minutes to extricate the patient, but there were only minor injuries to all parties who were involved.
- On 12/4, Chevron made a visit to the firehouse and presented a check to us for a donation of \$12,000.
- On 12/16, crews from Evans, LaSalle, & Platte Valley responded to the 3200 block of 23rd Avenue for a vehicle that had run into a building. The driver of the vehicle sustained serious injuries and crews shored up the affected area of the building to prevent any further damage. There were no other injuries to the occupants of the building.
- During the week of 12/16, we hosted live fire scenarios at our burn building with LaSalle and Platte Valley for all three shifts.
- On 12/20, A-Shift responded automatic aid with Platte Valley, LaSalle, and Greeley to a residential structure fire in the area south of Kersey. Crews were on scene for several hours extinguishing the fire and overhauling. There were no injuries to citizens or firefighters.
- On 12/21, B-Shift responded to a traffic accident in the 2200 block of 37th St. A single vehicle had struck a power box at a high rate of speed and rolled over numerous times ejecting the driver. The accident resulted in the loss of power to the surrounding area including our firehouse for approx. 20 hours. Prior to the power being restored, EFPD worked with the City of Evans and UC Health on a plan to provide a place for residents who would need power for oxygen or other medical necessities. Thankfully, this plan was not needed as power was restored by 4pm the following day.

- On 1/3, B-Shift responded to a traffic accident at the intersection of 23rd Ave and 37th St. Crews encountered two vehicles with heavy damage with patients trapped in one vehicle and the other vehicle was smoking. Two patients were extricated and transported with serious injuries. The accident resulted in one fatality and a total of three patients were transported to area hospitals.

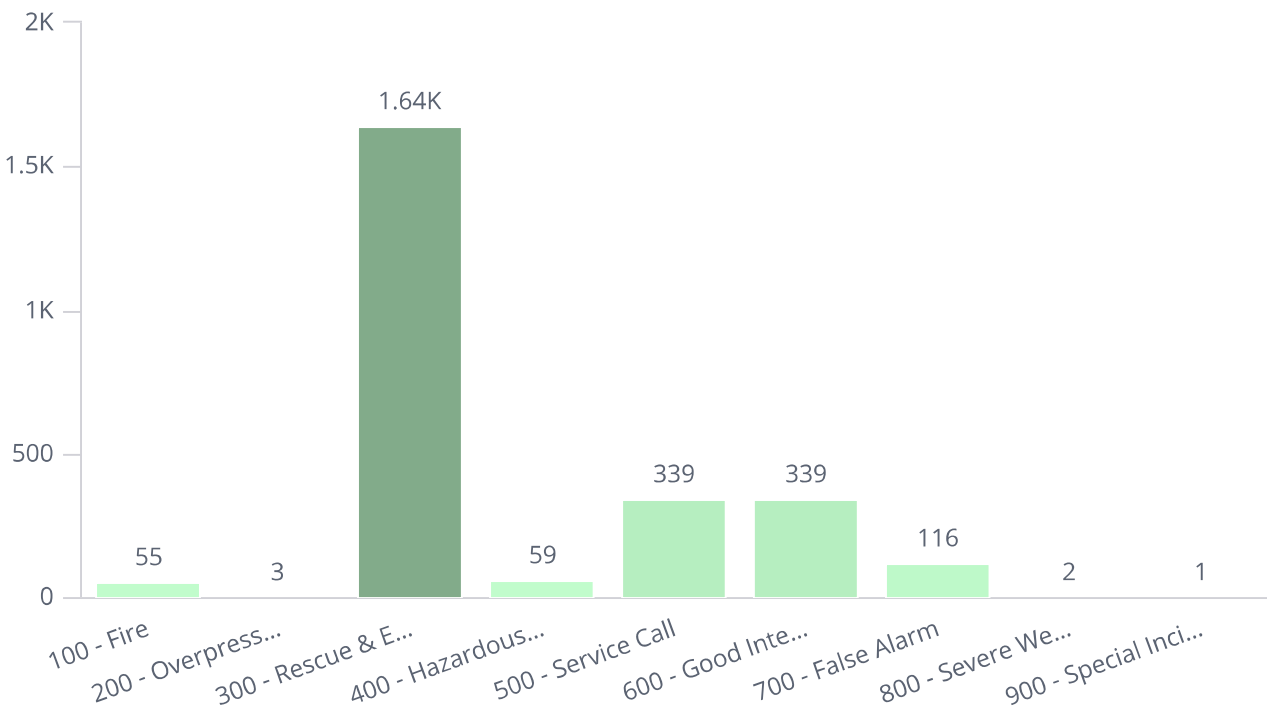
